


#### **LLR CPCS Data**

#### **NEW E-LEARNING**

We are delighted to let you know that the CPPE e-learning programme Cancer: supporting people with early diagnosis is now live and available to pharmacists, pharmacy technicians and trainee pharmacists via the CPPE website.

This programme will enable pharmacy professionals working across all practice settings to identify people who may have signs or symptoms of cancer, and support them to access services facilitating early cancer diagnosis.

On completion of the programme, learners will be able to recognise situations where a conversation may be needed about a referral for investigation regarding specific red flag symptoms for certain cancers, as well as identify those who may have additional barriers to accessing initial investigation of symptoms and tailor support to their individual needs.

# PharmRefer Interoperability with Pharmacy Systems

We previously informed you from the end of March 2023, all CPCS referrals generated by surgeries using the **PharmRefer app** will no longer be received directly into the CPCS modules within Cegedim, Positive Solutions or Sonar.


Instead, all such PharmRefer referrals into pharmacies using these IT systems will automatically be converted into an NHS Mail referral.

Therefore, all pharmacies using Cegedim, Positive Solutions or Sonar need to REGULARLY MONITOR their NHS mail inbox to check if a new CPCS referral has been received.

PharmRefer (for SystmOne practices) is a web-based referral tool for which practices will have a login and which captures the same patient demographic information and sends it directly to the community pharmacy system (PharmOutcomes). ## Continuity of care from prison to community

For people leaving prison, the period immediately after release can be difficult because they are at high risk of overdose and reoffending.

The Office for Health Improvement and Disparities (OHID), part of the Department of Health and Social Care, and HM Prison and Probation Service developed this continuity of care self-assessment tool.

The tool is to help local areas carry out a self-assessment to improve the continuity of care for people leaving prison who need alcohol and drug treatment.
