

Hypertension Case-Finding Service

IMPORTANT UPDATE



NHS England has published an updated HCFS specification.

The changes, agreed with Community Pharmacy England, better reflect the service's primary purpose of identifying people with previously undiagnosed hypertension.

KEY CHANGES TO THE SERVICE



Patients already being treated for hypertension are no longer eligible for a clinic check.



General exclusion for people who have had a blood pressure check in the last five years.



GP signposting is restricted to adults aged 40+ without a diagnosis of hypertension, who have not had a BP check in the last 5 years.



Other commissioned healthcare professionals (optometrists and dentists) can request ABPM following a clinic check in their service. This does not include another community pharmacy.



Requirements around patient consent, clinical judgement, escalation of abnormal results and health promotion have been clarified.



ABPM requirements clarified - time, minimum readings, follow-up of non-attenders and equipment availability.



Record keeping, claiming, monitoring and post-payment verification requirements have been updated.



Off-site provision limited to 4 days per financial year and continues to require prior ICB approval.



Guidance added on the process to request off-site provision and ICB approval framework.



Service continues to support earlier case-finding and better health outcomes for our communities.
